# Introduction

Since 2000, the international community has recognised the rights of migrants worldwide and celebrated their achievements on the 18th of December, International Migrants Day. Every year since then, migrant rights organisations, church groups, unions and local authorities organise activities in various countries, ranging from rallies and conferences to film festivals. Making migrants' voices heard is the common thread throughout these activities. And this is precisely what lies at the heart of Radio 1812, an initiative developed by the Belgium-based international NGO, December 18 vzw.

Launched in 2006 to celebrate International Migrants Day, Radio 1812 is a global one-day radio show connecting migrant communities worldwide, to highlight their concerns and celebrate their achievements; It aims to bring together radios from around the world over one day to produce, broadcast and share at least one programme on migration to celebrate International Migrants Day. In 2006, 54 radio stations in more than 25 countries participated in the radio event.

Following the success of the 2006 initiative, the December 18 team decided to renew the experience with the 2007 edition of Radio 1812. With over 150 radio stations from 34 countries, 68 audio files gathered so far<sup>1</sup> and 1800 visitors to the site on the day, the second edition of Radio 1812 was undoubtedly a success. Participation more than doubled with content produced and/or broadcasted from Australia to Ecuador in more than 15 languages from Arabic to Vietnamese<sup>2</sup>.

## Project Goals and Outputs

Based on the results of the 2006 edition, the December 18 team planned that the 2007 edition should aim to bring together at least 80 radios worldwide in 35 countries.

With 152 radios taking part in 34 countries the objectives of the 2007 edition were largely met. The event started early in Australia and ended on the West Coast of Latin America. Every region, from Australasia to Latin America was represented.

## Total participation: 152 radio stations

In 2007, Radio 1812 has seen a greater balance in the representation of participating radios language wise. Indeed, the 2006 edition mostly brought together English speaking radios with a good representation of Flemish and Italian radios whilst French and Spanish speaking radios were in much smaller numbers. In 2007, thanks to a re-organisation of the project around languages and geographic priorities, this imbalance has been addressed<sup>3</sup>.

In 2006, 12 radios from Spanish speaking countries took part in the global event. As the result of targeted and effective outreach efforts, a total of 38 radio stations broadcasting in Spanish participated in the 2nd edition of Radio 1812. This breaks down as follows: 15 radio stations in Spain, 20 in Latin America, and 3 in non-Spanish speaking countries<sup>4</sup> (Belgium, the Netherlands and Germany).

As far as French is concerned, the aim was to increase the participation at least threefold. In 2006, only 6 radios (in 6 countries) took part whilst 66 francophone radios (in 7 countries) took part<sup>5</sup> in Radio 1812/2007. Participation from Francophone countries accounted for 47% of the total level of participation.

Overall to date<sup>6</sup> the files produced and gathered during the International Migrants Day event were downloaded 2531 times, most of them during the week of 18 December 2007. Due to a lack of resources there are no figures available on the audience reached through the various radio programs. Some of the radio stations are community-based local stations; others have a much wider reach. This is especially the case with radios such as Radio Canada International, Radio Nacional de España, Radio Netherlands Worldwide, Sri Lanka Broadcasting Corporation, Antena 1 (Portugal) and Radio Taiwan International. Some participating radios have their own large local networks, as was the case in the Democratic Republic of the Congo.

## Collaboration

The 2006 pilot edition showed us that there was great interest from all radio broadcast sectors, from small grassroots community radios, to migrant radios, to online radios to national and global broadcasters. To further facilitate, sustain and expand the participation of radios in the marathon as well as to encourage collaboration between them, it was decided to organise regional workshops, bringing together radio journalists/producers and migrant organisations.

A first regional workshop was organised on 5th December 2007 in Brussels, bringing together 16 journalists from Belgium, Italy, France, Spain and the Netherlands. The approach used for the workshop was to provide a content session (on the new EU labour migration policies) and then to move into an interactive session building on the experiences of last year and moving to what will happen during the 2007 edition. A participant in Radio 1812/2006 shared her experience of organising Radio 1812 at national event by federating national and local Greek radios to the 18th December celebrations and the larger global Radio 1812 event. This account was truly inspiring because it showed how a network of migrant organisations can establish a successful collaboration with the main radio stations and use International Migrants Day as an opportunity for both celebration and action.

The workshop showed that for future editions regional workshops have the potential to consolidate and expand the participation as well as function as an opportunity to initiate new forms of collaboration.

Some concrete examples of joint initiatives in the context of the Radio 1812 global event are listed below:

- In Greece, the Greek Forum of Migrants worked together once again with various radio stations organising a mini national radio event for 18 December 2007.
- In London, Colourful Radio and December 18 collaborated around an interview with our special guest Thomas Hammarberg, Council of Europe Commissioner for Human Rights in a programme during which the latest EU policies on migration were explored and debated.
- In Flanders, Radio Centraal, Indymedia.be and KifKif jointly produced a special programme that was aired live on Radio Centraal.

## Radio 1812/2007 website

To facilitate participation from a greater range of radios and migrant groups, a new version of the Radio 1812 website was launched on 11th October 2007. The site now runs on a fully multilingual platform and is available in French, Spanish, Italian, Dutch and English. Additional functionalities were added, including the possibility to promote all Radio 1812 content onto networking sites such as Facebook or RSS sites such Del.i.cious, Google, Yahoo, etc. A direct news feed on migration issues was available from the December 18 website. The Radio 1812 web audience was also able to get all new Radio 1812 content directly to their desktop through our RSS feed. Furthermore, an updated design of the site was implemented including a new world map<sup>7</sup>, new logos and new banners.

In response to requests from radios in 2006, the December 18 team developed short and sharp introductory briefings on key themes relating to the migration field. These put together key figures and background information as well as a rich compilation of links to sites where more in-depth information is accessible. Additionally, an update on EU migration policies and the future challenges lying ahead in the European Union was put forward through an op-ed contribution by MEP Jean Lambert<sup>8</sup>.

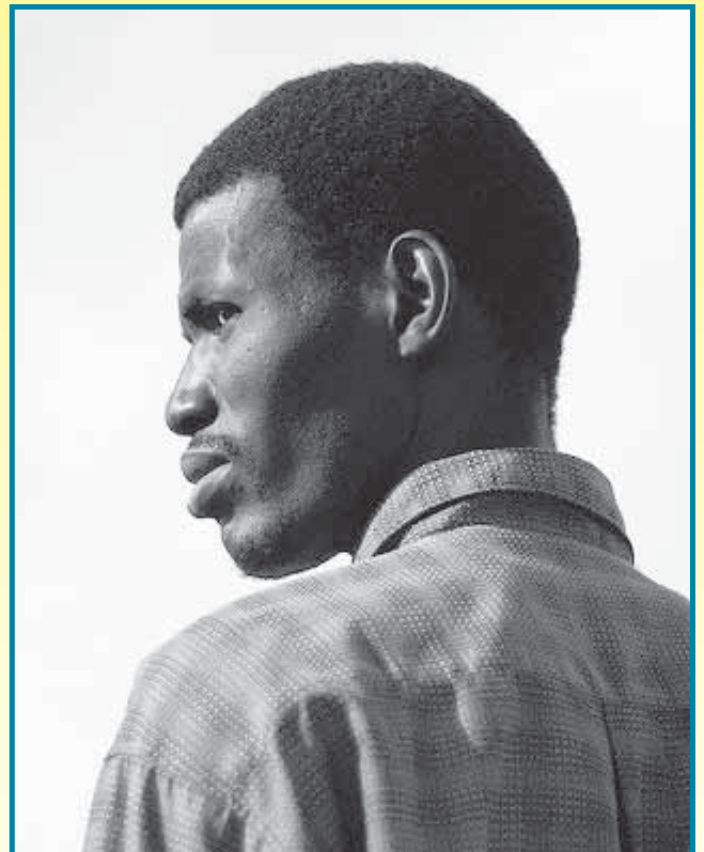

The team had set itself the objective to grow visits to the site by 25% on the day and for the whole of December 2007 in comparison with results in 2006.

The site was re-launched and promoted from 10th October 2007 and counted 61794 visits by the end of December 2007.

The site statistics for the month of December are as follows:

- Total number of visits: 29,663 (a growth of 84%)
- Total number of page views: 175,760 (a growth of 218%)
- Total number of visits on 18th December: 1866 (a growth of 5%)
- Total number of visits on 19th December: 1420 (a growth of 5%)

Whilst overall the site has attracted a lot more traffic, above the team's objectives, most of this traffic tends to reach the site ahead of International Migrants Day. This probably reflects the interest of people to discover the event, use existing audio on the site, post programmes broadcasted in the run up to the event, etc.

Finally, there has been a noticeable increase in the numbers of registered users who use the site to upload their own audio content onto the site in the run up and during the event. In 2006 fewer than 200 users registered to the Radio 1812 site whilst over 300 users registered in the 2007 edition. The recognition of the Radio 1812 site<sup>9</sup> by audio producers is a trend we hope to see grow over the 2008 and future editions.

## Promoting Radio 1812 and International Migrants Day

The 2nd edition of Radio 1812 was promoted at the NGO parallel event organised on the occasion of the Global Forum on Migration and Development in July 2007 in Brussels as well as during a Panos-led event about Diversity in the Media in October 2007.

The team collected 51 sites where the Radio 1812/2007 was mentioned, ranging from media related sites such as the Media Diversity Institute, Inter-Press Services, and Radio Sans Frontières, to international organisations such as UNESCO and networks such as ENAR or Migrants Rights Network UK.

Over 1000 people were subscribed to the special Radio 1812 mailing lists through which they received updates on the project's developments<sup>10</sup>.

Five jingles in English, French, Italian, Spanish and Dutch created by the December 18 team were amply used by radios in their programming on De-

ember 18, 2007<sup>11</sup>. New this year is that radios created their own version of the jingles in their own language. One was translated and broadcasted in Serbian and the other in Arabic, and then shared again on the Radio 1812 site.

## Resources and Budget

The Radio1812/2007 would not have been possible without the numerous hours of work contributed by the members of team<sup>12</sup> (many of them in a voluntary capacity). Financially, the 2nd edition of this project was supported by Unesco, the Taiwan Foundation for Democracy, Organisation Internationale de la Francophonie, and the Nationale Loterij. The total contributions from funding agencies amounted to Euro 33,000.

## Conclusion

The December 18 team is delighted with the response for this year's participation and the event was a true success. The level of commitment is best represented by Michel MAKUMBU AVELEDI, Radio Vuvu Kieto in the DRC who undertook a 300km return trip to post on to the Radio 1812 site the programme he had produced to celebrate International Migrants Day.

This year's event shows that Radio 1812 is a welcome initiative in various parts of the world and that when resources are put to promote and facilitate participation, the results can be felt. So, whilst the Radio1812 initiative undoubtedly shows strong potential and was welcomed by many as a valuable contribution to the celebrations of International Migrants Day, further editions will need significant and sufficient funding to sustain this level of growth.

**EU Migration Policy by

December 2007

The EU's immigration and asylum policy has in the past been characterised as 'fortress Europe': how can it be made as difficult as possible for people outside of the EU to access the territory? Member States have resisted attempts to agree common criteria for the entry of economic migrants and right wing politicians and press alike have distorted the facts and the debate.

While this undercurrent is still there and reflected in the development of re-admission agreements and an insistence on neighbouring countries tightening their border controls, there is a detectable shift in both rhetoric and policy in Commission and Parliament; we wait to see how Council responds.

Migration is now being recognised as a complex, multi-faceted area affecting all countries and all skill levels, and both men and women. We are gradually coming to have different pictures in our heads of who a migrant is - not only, for example, a weak, young African man washed up on a beach, or whatever the prevailing national image has been.

The European Parliament's reports on migration have recognised the need for migrant workers in an ageing Europe, their positive contribution to our societies and the need for an active, two way integration strategy.

First steps towards having a full policy on migration  
The Commission is now aiming to deal with the entry of migrant workers through a gradual and sectoral approach - with the eventual aim of having a full policy. The first proposal is for a directive on the entry of highly skilled migrants - the so called 'Blue Card', which aims to make the EU a more attractive destination by reducing barriers.

However, many of us doubt whether the limited proposals will really help attract this already highly mobile group. Seasonal workers will be the next group to be tackled, with a proposal likely to give priority for return to those who leave at the end of their work period. Inter-organise transfers are also in the work programme and this will clarify the position under the GATS agreements (1) on the free movement of service providers, some of the most highly paid and highly skilled migrants around. This will also help to remind people of the wide range of migrants. However, a more general proposal on migrants with other skill levels, probably the largest group, will have to wait.

Other areas, such as dealing with the demand for labour, which is the predominant "pull" factor, are also being tackled. There is a proposal for a directive on tackling employers who take on illegal (sic) workers, which proposes stringent penalties for repeat offenders who exploit such workers. Questions have been raised as to why we need new penalties for exploitation, when it is already supposed to be illegal. DG Employment and Social Affairs (2) has also brought out a Communication on undeclared work. These two proposals have served to highlight the very weak inspection regimes in some member states which have allowed the development of an often exploitative clandestine labour market, which has preyed on people being ignorant of their rights or being unable to find a way to access them. The fact that horrific working conditions in slave-like conditions has also been the experience of EU nationals from the newer member States has helped to publicise the reality for many third-country nationals, especially those in irregular situations. A key message for this year of Equal Opportunities for All was "know your rights" and we have seen the trade unions in a number of countries play a very important role in reaching out to migrant workers.

The increasing co-operation between the parts of the Commission dealing with Justice and Home Affairs and the Employment and Social Affairs sector is a very welcome development in my opinion. It signals a move to seeing migrants as part of society and a concern for their rights. EU legislation already recognises that there should be no discrimination on grounds of race or ethnicity either in the workplace or in access to goods and services. The social exclusion faced by many migrants has also been recognised in the national action plans drawn up under the Open Method of Coordination: it would be interesting to know how migrants are represented and consulted in that process. The EQUAL programme (3) has brought forward many excellent conclusions as to how to directly involve people in the projects and services that claim to provide for their needs. It is essential that these lessons are not lost with the ending of EQUAL. The conclusions of the 2006 Year of Mobility and that of the 2007 Year of Equal Opportunities for All should also be relevant to the experience of migrants.

### FRONTEX border security and control

This year has also seen some tough questions asked about the role of FRONTEX (4), not least in the question of rescue at sea. The European Parliament was horrified by pictures of migrants left clinging to the net of a tuna fishing boat, while an argument went on as to which country had responsibility for them. There still seems to be no agreement about how to proceed once people are picked up: we are in no doubt that they must be. Member States have failed to deliver on their commitments to provide resources for FRONTEX, just as they have failed to deliver on fishing inspection vessels for West African countries, which are seeing their fishing industries wiped out – is it any wonder people can't make a living and choose to migrate? There is still no real transparency on the FRONTEX mandate.

Questions are now being asked about whether the Dublin 2 Regulation concerning which country takes responsibility for dealing with an asylum claim can really be effective, especially for countries such as Malta, which deals with considerable numbers of migrants and does not have the means to assess protection needs properly. Some of us have always questioned the real value and effect of the Regulation.

### Pilot Projects in Countries-of-Origin

There are now pilot projects in countries-of-origin, Mali and Ukraine, which are aiming to make migrants more aware of the realities of life in the EU and to offer training programmes in partnership with certain companies to ensure people coming have the right skills as well as the right documents. There are still issues to be resolved concerning the recognition of qualifications for many third-country-nationals. The Commission has also been involved in advertising ventures in countries such as Nigeria to dissuade people from coming to the EU irregularly, pointing out that the streets are not paved with gold.

### The Returns Directive: First major piece of co-decision

Also on the table at the moment is the Returns Directive. This is the first major piece of co-decision for the Parliament in the field of migration and asylum policy and is proving very difficult, as can be imagined. The aim is to give a known procedure, including detailing an individual's rights, if compulsory return becomes necessary.

Many Member States use detention, some for indefinite periods and some bend their rules to maintain detention beyond their legal limit. So, Parliament is trying to steer a course between the ideal of voluntary return, no detention and no re-entry bans, and the reality of trying to put limits and a real respect for the individual in to what is the current practice.

However, the growing use of co-decision in this field at least gives a greater opportunity for input from organisations and individuals with real experience, rather than just leaving the task to governments alone. The EU is coming to terms with the fact that migration is a reality; it is a global phenomenon in which EU nationals participate. Migrant workers, of all skill levels, are an economic necessity and we have to address the many different aspects of migration – not just border control. The challenge is to see if we can do that and keep an awareness of migrants as individuals and not just cogs in an economic machine. If migration is to work as successfully as possible we need to look at the social dimension and how this interacts with the settled population: how we can establish the closest possible equality of rights and deliver those for all who reside in the EU? We should also be brave enough to examine how EU policies on trade, energy and agriculture for example, impact on development elsewhere. Migration should be a matter of choice, not necessity.



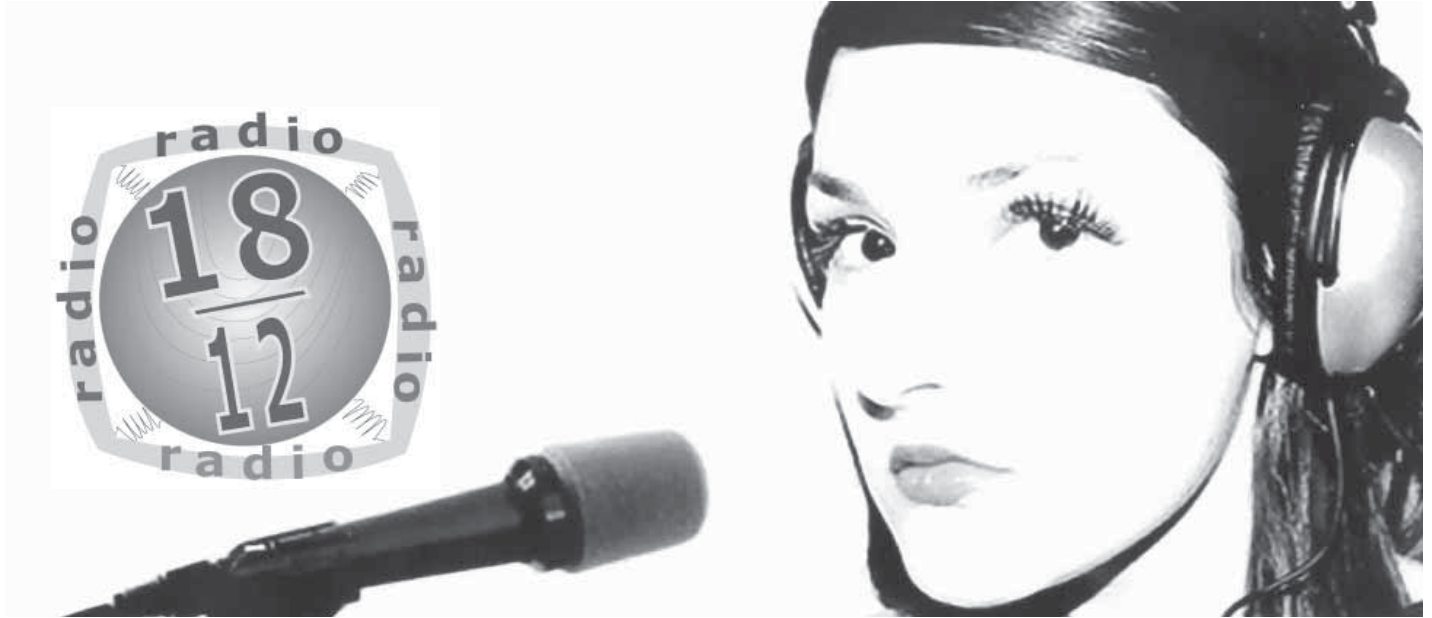
